
A New

It sells for \$15.95 and \$3 goes to buy wood to build bookcases, \$3 goes to the Newspaper in Education program in our schools, \$3 goes to fund Journalism Internships (Jim's way of giving back) and the balance to spread the project to other communities. When this book becomes a "Symbol" for literacy in America, and each time someone buys a book they know where the money is going, we will begin to win the battle.
